ACCESS ARRANGEMENTS AND REASONABLE ADJUSTMENTS (AARA)

Schools are responsible for administering assessment within Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) guidelines and within the requirements of the syllabus. In order to meet quality assurance processes for Applied, Applied (Essential), General and General (Extension), including alternative sequences, General (Senior External Examinations) subjects, and short courses assessment must follow QCAA guidelines.

Under the Disability Standards for Education 2005 (DSE), schools are also responsible for ensuring that adjustments are provided, to enable students with disability, determined by EAP and/or NCCD, to access and participate in assessment on the same basis as their peers.

Adjustments under AARA are actions designed to minimise barriers to learning, participation and access to the curriculum.

- AARA are determined in conjunction with students and parents/carers
- Adjustments are 'reasonable' when they achieve the purpose of enabling access and participation for the student on the same basis as other students

Aviation High School has an AARA committee that oversees the AARA process within the school. The committee comprises the Guidance Officer, Head of Department Senior Schooling, STARS Support Co Ordinator.

QCAA guidelines stipulate that schools make decisions about AARA for Units 1 and 2 (Year 11). Schools ensure that AARA implemented for an eligible student for Applied, Applied (Essential) and General subjects, in Units 1 and 2 aligns to available accommodations for summative assessment in Units 3 and 4 (Year 12).

The provision of an AARA for assessment in Units 1 and 2 by the school is not a guarantee that an AARA will be provided, or that students will be provided the same access or adjustments for assessments in Units 3 and 4.

How to apply:

<u>Units 1 and 2 – Year 11</u>

- 1. Students/families are directed to the school web page to access this document. The Guidance Officer should be contacted for clarification and expectations
- 2. Students / families complete the AARA application form and include all supporting documentation see school web page or QCAA website.
- 3. Students may also complete the confidential student report if they choose https://www.qcaa.qld.edu.au/senior/assessment/aara/resources
- Student lodges completed AARA application with the Guidance Officer to establish eligibility and to meet QCAA submission dates. Guidance Officer will contact families if further evidence is required
- 5. Guidance Officer provides the completed application and supporting documentation to the AARA committee for review and approval for Units 1 and 2
- 6. Students and families are notified of the outcome by the Guidance Officer
- 7. Guidance Officer relays confirmation of AARA eligibility and accommodation/s to relevant teachers, HOD's, deputy principal responsible for exams

Units 3 and 4 – Year 12

- 1. Steps 1-3 as above for a new application
- 2. Confidential medical report is completed again if required
- 3. Guidance Officer completes confidential school statement
- 4. Guidance Officer lodges AARA application with all supporting documentation in QCAA portal
- 5. Guidance Officer notifies year 12 students / families of AARA outcome
- 6. AARA and supporting documentation is scanned and attached to students OneSchool support provisions
- 7. Original documentation filed in the student's file

Supporting Documentation

Please note: supporting documentation must be included with your AARA application for consideration of submission as per QCAA guidelines.

Medical report:

To make an informed decision about an AARA application, the QCAA requires a medical report that includes the following details:

- the illness, condition or event (including details of a diagnosis, where applicable)
- date of onset or occurrence of the disability; illness and/or medical condition (must cover date of assessment)
- symptoms, treatment or course of action related to the medical condition or event
- explanation of the probable effect of the illness, condition or event on the student's participation in the assessment, particularly timed assessment when considering timed assessment
- professional recommendations regarding AARA

The medical report must be completed by a relevant practitioner who is a general practitioner (GP), medical specialist, or psychologist (registered under Queensland's *Medical Practitioners Registration Act 2001* and/or Queensland's *Psychologists Registration Act 2001*), and who is not related to the student or employed by the school.

Non-Medical Supporting Documentation:

- for non-medical claims, must be written evidence from a relevant independent professional or other independent third party, such as a witness or police report
- Supporting documentation must cover the date of the assessment for which the application is made

Confidential medical report

Access arrangements and reasonable adjustments (AARA)

The QCAA requires a medical report for medical claims for AARA or illness and misadventure. Medical reports may only be completed by the student's general practitioner (GP), medical specialist, or psychologist (registered under Queensland's *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act 2009*). The health professional providing a report must not be related to the student or employed by the school. The information provided needs to be current and relate to the relevant assessment period.

Information provided in this report is treated in strictest confidence and is used only for the purpose of determining the AARA application.

If the health professional does not use this report form, they must supply a current medical report containing all of the following information.
