

Uniform Policy / Dress Code

Aviation High School is a uniform school because the Parents and Citizens' Association, representing the parents/caregivers of this school, decided at the outset to support the wearing of uniforms.

The advantages of wearing school uniforms include:

developing a sense of belonging to a group pride in membership of that group, and identification of students travelling to and from school

This is our expectation, and we urge all parents to support the accepted standard of dress as detailed below, by ensuring that their children wear the correct and appropriate uniform at all times.

Notes on General Appearance of Students

Hats must be worn when travelling to and from school and when in the sun

Hair must be neat, clean and a natural colour. Hairstyles should not distract students from learning and hairstyle should enable the hat to be worn

All hair must be tied back if shoulder length or longer

If ribbons are worn to, during and from school, only ribbons in school colours of dark blue, light blue, white or red are acceptable

Black, leather formal shoes must have laces and be clean

Make up must not be worn

Nails must be natural and short – no nail polish (no artificial nails).

No facial piercings allowed

Neck chains with locker keys or religious medals must be worn at any time against the skin out of sight

Wrist watches are acceptable

One small plain stud or sleeper earring in each ear lobe is acceptable

No other jewellery is allowed

No visible tattoos

Boys must be clean shaven

Students must wear the school sport broadbrim hats as per the uniform policy because of the high incidence of skin cancer in Queensland.

Uniform Detention Procedure

If a student is out of uniform and does not have a uniform pass they will be given a detention and be required to complete this 30 minute detention after school on the following day.

Formal uniform must be worn at all times except on designated sport days (Snr – Wed and Jnr – Tues) when the student has Sport. If students are participating in sport or Physical Education on other days, they must wear the formal uniform while travelling to and from school and change for their Physical Education lesson. They must change back into formal uniform to travel home.

Girls Formal Uniform

Short sleeved shirt – Blue background for years 7, 8 and 9; White background for years 10, 11 and 12

Slacks or skirt which must be worn no higher than the knee

Black or navy stockings or knee high navy socks

Scarf – compulsory years 7–12

Fully enclosed lace-up formal (leather/vinyl) Oxford black shoes compulsory

Blazer compulsory years 10/11/12

Hat, compulsory – formal style only

Boys Formal Uniform

Long or short sleeved shirt – Blue background for years 7, 8 and 9; White background for years

10, 11 and 12

Long pants or shorts

Knee high navy socks with shorts; midcalf plain navy socks with long trousers

Plain black belt

Tie – compulsory years 7–12

Fully enclosed lace-up formal (leather/vinyl) Oxford black shoes compulsory

Blazer compulsory years 10/11/12

Hat compulsory – formal style only

Sport Uniform

Girls shirt

Boys shirt

Unisex uniform sport shorts

Midcalf plain white socks

Plain black lace-up (leather/vinyl) sport shoes (non-marking soles)

Hat compulsory – sports style only
